KSA Executive Director Wagner Report

KSA Executive Director Jerry Wagner- copies of the March Financial reports were distributed to the board.

Motion was made to approve the KSA Boys and Girls financial report made by Sheriff Gaines and seconded by Sheriff Blackburn. Motion was approved unanimously.

KSA Ranch- The hiring of Counselors is almost completed. There are two open positions, one for housekeeping and the other for maintenance.

Director Wagner passed out golf towels, coolie cups, and back packs. The towels and cups will be used for the golf outing and the backpacks will be given to each camper at the ranch this year.

Sheriff Gaines made a motion to pay for the cost of the backpacks in the amount of \$2,100 2nd by Sheriff Wright. Motion was approved unanimously.

Meeting with the Auditor- Director Wagner addressed the board in reference to a meeting with the state auditor along with Colonel Morgan from Kenton County Sheriff's Office. Auditor Edelen asked the Sheriffs Association for a letter in reference to support looking at Special Taxing District throughout the Commonwealth. **(See letter attached)** Other topics discussed with the Auditor included the inconsistent manner in which sheriff's office were audited. The Auditor agreed to attend the KSA Conference to discuss audits and try to help with this issue.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

911 board rejects constable's request to be on 911 radio frequency

The Owensboro-Daviess County 911 board has passed on a proposal to allow constables to use sheriff's department radio frequencies to call for assistance in case of emergencies.

At the board's meeting Thursday morning, the 911 board members declined to put to a vote the proposal by East County Constable David Underhill. In February, Underhill asked that constables be allowed to use the sheriff's department radio frequency to call for backup; previously, Underhill told the board members constables and deputy constables serving papers could find themselves in dangerous situations and would have to call 911 on their cell phones.

"Cell phones drop calls," Underhill told the board in February. In an emergency, it's possible "you would not have time to get your cell phone," Underhill said.

At the February meeting, the board asked Underhill to consult with City Attorney Ed Ray and County Attorney Claud Porter to come up with a plan for how constables would use the frequency. The board also asked Underhill to poll other Daviess County constables about whether they also were interested in using the frequency.

At Thursday's meeting at the Owensboro Police Department, Ray said he did meet with the three county constables, and it was left up to West County Constable Paul Westerfield and Central County Constable Ray Westerfield to decide if they wanted to join Underhill in his request. Paul Westerfield, who was at Thursday's meeting, said he did not think it was necessary for constables to have access to sheriff's department radio frequencies.

"I really don't think we need it," Westerfield told board members. "We've got a cell phone. We've already invested in our own communications." Westerfield said his position was shared by Constable Ray Westerfield.

"We've got our own radio frequency," Paul Westerfield said. If necessary, a deputy constable could use his radio to contact another constable for assistance.

Underhill said if a constable or deputy constable could not reach a fellow constable on his radio, he would have to try to call 911 on his cell phone.

"I'd hate to have my guys depend on a cell phone if they needed help," Underhill said. "The (constables') radio ... is no better than a walkie talkie. I would not stake my life on a cell phone."

After the meeting, Sheriff Keith Cain, co-chairman of the 911 board, said allowing constables to use the sheriff's department's radio frequency would be tantamount to providing a means where constables could perform law enforcement duties.

Article IV

Section 1: The following officers shall be elected at each annual convention: President, Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms, and ten members elected to serve as Board Directors. The Immediate Past President shall serve along with each officer for one year. As a Past President you will continue to serve on the Board of Directors as long as you are an elected Sheriff. Any Kentucky Sheriff duly elected as a Sheriff of the Commonwealth who is appointed or duly elected to fill a position to the National Sheriffs Association board, shall be a member of the Kentucky Sheriffs' Association Board of Directors with full voting powers as long as they are on the board of the National Sheriffs' Association. Vacancies in any office except that of President shall be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors for the unexpired term. The President should move up from Vice-President in case President resigns or passes away. The President, Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms, and ten members elected to serve as Board Directors term will consist for one calendar year, beginning on January 1st and the term of office shall commence on December 31 of that year.

Section 2: Any officer may be removed by the Board of Directors for just cause.

Section 3: Additional nominations for officer of the Association may be made from the floor at the opening session of the annual convention. Only Sheriffs who were duly elected may be nominated for any office of the Kentucky Sheriffs' Association Board of Directors. He/She must be duly sworn Sheriff during the fall term on the Board of Directors.

Section 4: The election of officers from among those duly nominated shall be held on the final day of the annual convention. Voting shall be a secret ballot. Ballots shall be counted openly by the Secretary-Treasurer and the results immediately announced to the membership. He/She may appoint such tellers as may be needed in the vote tabulation. The President, Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms, and ten members elected to serve as Board Directors term will consist for one calendar year, beginning on January 1st and the term of office shall commence on December 31 of that year.

Section 5: No person shall vote in any election unless he/she is in attendance and registered at the convention, his annual assessment has been paid, and he is an active Sheriff, one bonded Deputy of an active Sheriff, all former Sheriffs (not presently in office) and all newly elected Sheriffs may vote if (1) his county assessment has been paid or (2) he pays his annual dues of \$30.00. Each shall have one vote. He shall identify himself by name and county as an "A" (Active Sheriff), "B" (Bonded Deputy), "C" (Sheriff-elect), or "D" (Former Sheriff) to the Treasurer before being handed a ballot in the election. The Secretary-Treasurer, with his/her assistants, shall keep an accurate record of those who received ballots.

Proposed Changes to KSA By Laws

Article IV

Section 1: The following officers shall be elected at each annual convention: President, Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice- President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms and ten members elected to serve as Board of Directors. The Immediate Past President shall serve along with each officer for one year. As a Past President you will continue to serve on the Board of Directors as long as you are an elected Sheriff. Any Kentucky Sheriff duly elected as a Sheriff of the Commonwealth who is appointed or duly elected to fill a position to the National Sheriff's Association board, shall be a member of the Kentucky Sheriff's Association Board of Directors with full voting powers as long as they are on the board of the National Sheriff's Association. Vacancies in the offices of Secretary-Treasurer and Sergeant-at-Arms shall be appointed by the Board of Directors for the unexpired term. Vacancies of the President, Vice President and Second Vice-President shall be filled as follows: The Vice-President should move to President in case the current President resigns, is removed or passes away. The Second Vice-President should move up to Vice-President in case the current Vice-President is moved up, resigns, removed or passes away. The Third Vice-President should be moved up to Second Vice-President in case the current Second Vice-President is moved up, resigns, removed or passes away.

The Third Vice-President vacancy shall be filled as follows: The person that ran for the position of Third Vice-President that was the second highest vote total will fill the unexpired term of Third Vice-President. If that person declines, then the next highest vote total will fill the vacancy. If no one accepts the position, then it falls to the Board of Directors to appoint someone to fill the unexpired term. The President, Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms and the ten members elected to serve as board of Directors term will consist for one calendar year, beginning on January 1st and the term of office shall commence on December 31st of that year.

Section 2: Unchanged

Section 3: Additional nominations for the offices of Third Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms and the Board of Directors of the Association may be made from the floor at the opening session of the annual convention. Only Sheriffs who were duly elected may be nominated for the offices of Third Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms and the Board of Directors for the Kentucky Sheriff's Association. He/She must be duly sworn Sheriff during the full term on the Board of Directors.

NEW ADDITION

Section 4: The office of the President is filled by the election of the Vice-President by making a motion to cast one unanimous vote by the Secretary-Treasurer and a second to the motion and then ratified by the membership. The office of the Vice-President is filled by the election of the Second Vice-President by making a motion to cast one unanimous vote by the Secretary-Treasurer and a second to the motion and then ratified by the membership. The office of the Second Vice-President is filled by the election of the Third Vice-President by making a motion to cast one unanimous vote by the Secretary-Treasurer and a second to the motion and then ratified by the membership.

NEW ADDITION

Section 5: The Election of the ten members of the Board of Directors shall be as follows: There will be nominations for the Board of Directors from the floor and one or more Sheriffs in good standing from each of the ten districts will be on the ballot and the entire membership present eligible to vote will elect one Sheriff per district to make up the ten member Board of Directors. If no one in any district presents themselves for the position, then the President may appoint someone at his discretion to fulfill the remaining position.

Section 6: Old section 4 is now section 6.

Section 7: Old section 5 is now Section 7.
